Include discussion of the boardapproved priority projects and the process for board monitoring of regional/chapter plan implementation. Café Conversations (50) * Participants will engage in three 15-minute rounds of progressive café conversations where they will address a specific question focused on the content of the previous speakers. * Each table will be hosted by a facilitator who will pose the question, invite participant comments and interactions, and after the first round, synthesize the previous conversations. * Round 1 Question: What are we currently doing in our regions and chapters that supports the CABE COMPASS? * Round 2 Question: What more could we do this year and next to support the CABE COMPASS and have a greater impact? * Round 3 Question: What will we commit to doing to support each other in living the CABE COMPASS?
