# Fall Facts

---

The Legislature sent 1,166 bills to the Governor.

The Governor signed a total of 997 bills and vetoed 169 bills.

The November election will result in 1/3 new Assembly Members.

The 2023-24 Legislative Session will begin on December 5<sup>th</sup>.

The Governor will release his proposed budget on January 10<sup>th</sup>.

- The total cumulative fiscal shortfall through September 2022 is now \$6.967 billion.

CABE will be working behind the scenes during the fall to prepare for next years priorities.

# CABE Victories

---

**Educator Workforce Investment Grant (EWIG)** – CABE secured funding in the June budget to continue the EWIG program. The initial budget language would have limited CABE’s ability to continue participating. CABE was able to get the final budget bill’s language amended to allow non-profit organizations to be included at a more significant level.

**AB 1868 (Rivas)** – Will disaggregate data regarding Long-Term English Learner students to ensure they are correctly identified and provided with targeted interventions. This bill was signed by the Governor and will become law on January 1, 2023.

# Upcoming Legislative Hearings

---

**October 26** – The Assembly Higher Education Committee will be holding a hearing at the California State University San Bernardino on preparing teachers for the K-12 Ethnic Studies requirement.

**November 15** – The Assembly Budget Subcommittee No. 2 on Education Finance will be holding a hearing at the capitol on educator workforce shortages and pipeline oversight.
